REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT

PRESIDENT 2015 - 2018

An Annual Report reflects on the activities of the last year and offers challenges for the future so that members know what happened and what may lie ahead. It is in fact our historical record of the Canterbury Horticultural Society (CHS).

2018 was an interesting year and a very busy one for me as President and for the Board as a whole, with many activities taking considerable time and effort.

2018 Autumn Garden Show in the Christchurch Botanic Gardens was very successful with over 14,000 people attending. Displays and information were wonderful and the weather was perfect. However it was a costly investment.

Special thanks to Sandi MacRae, Michael Coulter and Rachel Vogan for their efforts in making the event so memorable.

Consideration for a 2019 Autumn Garden Show was debated by the Board who agreed that rather than running a 2019 Show the establishment of a Garden Show Trust was the best way to develop and stage further shows like this in Christchurch.

The new Trust has been set up and is chaired by Athol McCully.



Thanks go to Sandi MacRae for all the work she has undertaken in helping to set up the Trust.

The Edible Garden Awards, in partnership with the Christchurch City Council continued to grow in 2018 with many entries from the Waipapa/Papanui-Innes and Waihoro/Spreydon-Cashmere Community Boards.

Thanks to David Adams, Michael Coulter and assessors.

In February 2018 the CCC advertised for Registration of Interest in leasing the former **Tea Kiosk** in the Christchurch Botanic Gardens. The CHS responded to this request with a full proposal.

Thanks to the Friends of the Botanic Gardens for joining in this venture.

In June our Registration of Interest went before the Waikura/Linwood-Central-Heathcote Community Board which determined that best use was as a community facility. We were of the CHS being granted the lease of the building which we have named **The Kiosk**.

On the 1st of March 2019 we received the key to The Kiosk. There is still work to be done to improve the facilities and really make it our home.

All About Gardening continued throughout the year at the Christchurch Bridge Club with an average monthly attendance of approximately 160 members and visitors, over both sessions.

The 2018 Oderings School Gardens Show at the Woolston Working Men's Club was again very successful with great participation from the schools.

Thanks to Ray King, Annette Hill and their team.

During the year the Board handed over the CHS garden competitions to the Christchurch Beautifying Society. The multiple competitions were getting confusing and the Board felt having

ORCHARDS IN SCHOOLS LEGACY PROJECT

This project continues to grow rapidly. In 2018 five new schools joined taking the total to 22.

This is a legacy project for the CHS and the schools as the orchards will be in place for many years. *Thanks to Allan Paterson and Mary Tingey*. one competition would encourage greater participation.

The CHS Office relocated from Lichfield St when the new Government came into office and work sped up on planning for the new Stadium.

We are very grateful to Liz Parder our Office Manager for allowing us to use her home as a temporary office.

The CHS relinquished its lease on the **Otakaro Orchard** site once the Food Resilience Network became an incorporated Society.

Managing the CHS is a team effort.

Early in the year Tony Kunowski left the CHS and Liz Parder was promoted

to Office Manager. Emma Velde continues as Communications person part-time.

Gail Scrivener resigned as our contracted tour co-ordinator in December. Gail provided a wide range of high quality tours over the many years she worked with us.

Thanks to all the Board members for their support and hard work in the many tasks we undertake throughout the year.

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE SUMMARY

The 2018 year highlights were:

Total revenue was \$418,000 (2017 \$279,000 excluding sale of property) with the major contributor to the variance being the investment revenue form ANZ.

2018 YEAR HIGHLIGHTS

It should be noted

that Subscriptions, our basic income were \$19,437 (2017 \$22,669) and membership is an issue to be addressed in the coming year.

Total expenditure was \$448,000 (2017 \$392,000) with the cost of the Autumn Garden Show at \$106,000 (2017 \$3,000) being mainly responsible for the difference.

The Operating Loss for the year was \$29,000 an improvement on 2017 (\$122,000 loss) due to the property sale monies being invested for the full year.

The total equity at 31 December 2018 was \$2,112,000 (2017 \$2,199,000) which includes the write down in the value of the Society's Trophies by \$58,000 as discussed at last year's AGM.

The ANZ investments are split between an Income Portfolio (\$919,000) and a Growth Portfolio (\$1,188,000) which gives us more balanced investments than previously. During the year



we drew down \$190,000 from the investments (8.6% of our opening equity) to support the cash flow required to operate the Society.

The overall investment returns for the 2018 year were, including fees, (2.72%) for the Growth Portfolio and 5.49% for the Income Fund. The December Quarter saw the values of stocks and shares around the world retreat but the first two months of 2019 saw this reversed with the returns reported as 8.63% for the Growth Portfolio and 2.84% for the Income Portfolio.

The Annual Accounts were prepared by Ainger Tomlin and independently audited by Ashton Wheelens with no significant issues being raised apart from the inclusion of the associated Circles accounts being incorporated in the Society's Annual Accounts which will necessitate changes to their balance dates to come into line with the Society's.
